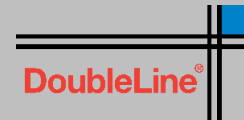

## Investment Objective and Approach

The Fund's objective is to seek total return which exceeds the total return of the S&P 500 Index. The Fund seeks to invest in the securities that correspond to the four "cheapest" sectors of the U.S. large-cap equity market. The Fund is rebalanced on a monthly basis to create an investment return that approximates that of the CAPE® Index.

## Investment Philosophy

The Fund aims to incorporate the principles of long-term investing distilled by Professor Robert Shiller through his work on the CAPE® Ratio, via the CAPE® Index. The Index aims to identify undervalued sectors based on a modified CAPE® Ratio, and then uses a momentum factor to seek to mitigate the effects of potential value traps.

### Definition of Terms

**Average Daily Volume** - Consolidated daily volume of shares traded, averaged over the last 30 calendar days.

**Market Price** - The price at which shares in the ETF can be bought or sold on the exchanges during trading hours, while the net asset value (NAV) represents the value of each share's portion of the fund's underlying assets and cash at the end of the trading day.

**Price-to-Book (P/B) Ratio** - Used by companies to compare a firm's market capitalization to its book value. It's calculated by dividing the company's stock price per share by its book value per share (BVPS). An asset's book value is equal to its carrying value on the balance sheet, and companies calculate it netting the asset against its accumulated depreciation.

**Price-to-Earnings (P/E) Ratio** - This ratio for valuing a company measures current share price relative to earnings per share (EPS). The P/E ratio is also sometimes known as the "price multiple" or the "earnings multiple." A high P/E ratio could mean that a company's stock is overvalued, or investors are expecting high growth rates in the future.

**SEC Yield** - Standard yield calculation developed by the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) that allows for fairer comparisons of bond funds. It is based on the most-recent 30-day period covered by the fund's filings with the SEC. The yield figure reflects the fund's dividends and interest earned during the period after the deduction of the fund's expenses. It is also referred to as the "standardized yield." Gross and net SEC yields may differ due to the Fund's investment in affiliate funds.

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
